#### Please add one suggestion to help improve the school for all our pupils

- No split classes
- All children to have one coat (winter) so all children look the same and do not compete over clothes.
- I think you're pretty much got everything spot on! Great team from teaching to Office staff, caretaking to Kitchen!
- Alas you are governed by Warwickshire County Caterers who aren't great.....
- Too much homework
- Classroom for Year 5
- A class per year group
- The staff car park should be locked during the day (it is locked at 8.50am and opened again at 3.10pm)
- Older years are sometimes (or appear to be) rushed at lunchtimes, especially those with packed lunches. Important to ensure that ALL children have time to each and finish their lunches. Please can this be looked at?
- Talk homework I do not feel this is of great benefit to children in older years. Appreciate it may be good for KS1 but could older children have sometimes a bit more 'research' based to home those skills, which they need at secondary school.
- I think more could be done to stretch the more able pupils. I think behaviour in Year 5/6 last year was a regular

distraction.

- Let parents know if help is needed before cancelling events for children, a quick text will ensure every event can take place.
- I feel there is too much homework in Key Stage 1. Younger ones need to be able to come home and let go, play and be kids, not feel pressure to complete homework.
- More parking/crossing control/traffic calming/additional zebra crossing nearer community centre. Work with council
  to request improvements.
- Take your time to listen to your pupils and each other.
- Change hot dinner provider
- Certainly my child and others can talk to midday supervisor at lunch but during class I don't know if there is a system for support if there are problems.
- Rewarding definitely lunchtime healthy eating is good. Not sure about benefit of always aiming to get a rewards.
- Would be good if parents could meet governors/be introduced.
- Attendance award although understandably assist with encouraging attendance; also has negative effect on those with medical issues that 'can't get 100% attendance". Very miffed not to have a shot at W H Smith voucher!
- Blue letters need to be followed through with exclusion after 6 letters. Many children been seen to have more than 6 and not excluded so the impact is lost!
- New goal posts
- Allowing two parents to be on general distribution lists also different as parents may have different roles in childcare, but bot may need to know about particular events.
- Proper policing of healthy lunch box policies and improved nutrition in school meals (too much carb, not enough veg).
- Both children have requested an Art group they can join.
- Regular passing to parents of scores children get in ongoing tests/assessments and where they sit in relation to other kids of same school year so parents really understand how their child is doing – at least every term.
- Same level of homework as private schools give.
- Providing a school bus for the children from outlying villages instead of the constant criticism about parking would be lovely! (Like all other schools I know in the area)
- There should be some free afterschool clubs for the children.
- Not enough notice for anything eg parents evenings, mother's day events, meet the teacher difficult if working and limited support.
- Concerns over year splits further up the school and impact on educational and social needs of my child.
- Involve all parents in school life, can be difficult to be involved if work on Fridays.
- It would be nice if classes would be able to go into school at different times, maybe 5 minutes apart. For example R, Year 1 & Year 2 together then the rest of the school. Makes saying goodbyes easier.
- Would like opportunities to look at classroom displays, as can't do this at parents evening.
- More sports
- Our major bug bare about the school is the ridiculous parking around the school. Also the way parents naturally congregate and chat by the school gates obscuring views of the exit/road preventing safe exit. (Please note there is additional parking available at the Community Centre.)
- More support needed for children who require extra assistance, especially the need to pick up issues like dyslexia much earlier
- More information please on what else we can do to encourage our children on and stretch them (in a positive constructive way).
- The opportunity to hear from and learn from motivational speakers who can give the children a glimpse of something new Bee Keepers, Tree Surgeons, Farmers, Journalists, Dancers, Para Olympics, Vets, Doctors, etc. etc. The list could be endless!
- Ensuring poor behaviour in class does not impact children who are not misbehaving.
- I don't really know much about the school yet, we've just started.
- I have a happy child in Year 1 and Year 3. Both are very happy. I do feel though Year 1 seem to have more organised home learning, expectations sent home on day 1 of school term. This model would be great to see in Year 3 also. Year 1 seem a little more challenged as well (might just be my 2!).
- Spellings and reading homework would be enough; I like my child to do Clubs etc. out of school too.
- Both of my children have asked if there is any sort of Art club which they could attend.
