To use drama to depict the Viking invasion of Lindesfarne. To write about the Viking sagas. Explore decoration of a Viking longboat and its purpose. <p>HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Praise your child and share an interest in what they are doing. • Recognise their achievements and celebrate them. • Ensure they undertake any home learning in a calm environment at a suitable time. • Ask questions to probe thought and recognise their own errors or misconceptions. • Ensure they have the right tools to do the job. • Take a break if required – do not spend more than the recommended time. • If it is proving too difficult, acknowledge that and write a note on it for the teacher. • <i>The most effective home learning is based on conversation about the world around them.</i>
