Summer 1: In History we will: Place the Tudors on a timeline and explore the Tudor family tree. Explore Tudor fashion through pictures and identify different pieces of Tudor clothing. Investigate the foods which Tudor people ate and find out about the new foods which were being brought to England at the time. Discover the punishments given to criminals during Tudor times and find out who was in charge of law and order. Explore the illnesses and diseases that were We will be looking at 6 main topics this term: 1. Capacity and Volume- reading scales and adding and subtracting capacity and volume. 2. Fractions- adding and subtracting fractions, finding fractions of sets and objects and amounts. 3. Money- understanding pounds and pence, adding a subtracting money, finding change. 4. Time- telling the time to one minute and exploring different units of time. 5. Shape- angles and right-angles, perpendicular and parallel lines, 2D and 3D shapes.

Reading books can be changed on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Children are encouraged to give their books in when they need changing and reading journals are checked once a week.

HOME LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

- To regularly read at home and sign the reading journal.
- To complete tasks on spag.com and Mathletics weekly, as well as regularly using Times Table Rockstars.
- To practise spellings using the handwriting lines and write sentences using the words in their green spelling books. Please make sure presentation is of a high standard and children use pencil.
- Please help your child to ensure their home learning is completed and handed in on time. If home learning tasks are regularly forgotten or handed in late, then children will need to complete this during break times in school. Please let us know if your child is unable to do their home learning or needs extra support.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME

- Praise your child and share an interest in what they are doing.
- Recognise their achievements and celebrate them.
- Ensure they undertake any home learning in a calm environment at a suitable time.
- Ask questions to probe thought and recognise their own errors or misconceptions.
- Ensure they have the right tools to do the job.
- Remember to let them take a break if required.

If any home learning task is proving too difficult, please leave the task and write a short note on the work. Alternatively, you can arrange an appointment to come in and discuss any concerns; we are here to help.

INFORMATION TO REMEMBER
