Muslim Worldviews



Knowledge Building Blocks:

- The five pillars of Islam are the most important beliefs and practises of Islam and those with Muslim Worldviews usually try to keep them: Shahada (declaration of one God-Allah– and his prophet Muhammad (PBUH), Salat (prayer). Zakat (giving). Sawm (fasting). Hajj (pilgrimage).
- Those with Muslim Worldviews can learn how to live well from the Qur'an (the Muslim Holy Book). Muslims usually believe that the Angel Gibril revealed the Qur'an to Muhammad (PBUH) and it is God's Word.
- Those with Muslim Worldviews often gather at the local mosque/masjid.
- Those with Muslim Worldviews believe in one God they refer to as 'Allah'.
- The Qur'an contains 99 Beautiful Names of Allah that provide insights into what God is like for those with Muslim worldviews. These are often written in beautiful calligraphy.
- Muslim women and girls might choose to wear a hijab but they might not. In the UK they can make their own decisions about clothing.
