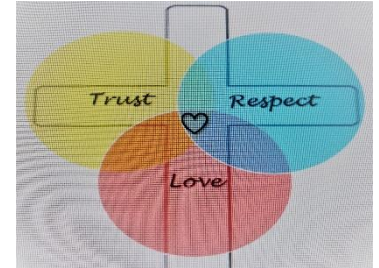

### **Courageous Advocates**

Thank you to Si Medicott who gave up a week of the Easter holidays to walk from Glasgow to Fort William to raise funds for FoES. The walk of 119 miles took Si 5 days to complete and he raised a whopping £1025.00! A huge achievement. Well done, Si.

### **Sport**

Golf is a fantastic game for all ages and all the children at Ettington were able to try this out for themselves when we were joined at school by PGA golf professional, Martin Warren. Whilst at school, he taught the children golf skills and they all had a go at playing golf with different challenges and games. It was enjoyed by all and there were even a few holes in ones!

Year 6 took part in a boys and girls football match against Barford with the boys winning in a 7-6 thriller. Although the girls suffered defeat, they all enjoyed the challenge. After half term there will be athletics, rounders and football for different ages as well as a GB athlete visiting.

Nekoda Smythe-Davis became national champion of Great Britain on two occasions, winning the lightweight division at the British Judo Championships in 2013 and 2014. In 2014, she was selected to represent England at the 2014 Commonwealth Games in Glasgow. Competing in the women's 57 kg category she won the gold medal. Joe Roebuck who is an English swimmer may be joining her in school also.

Prior to the Great British athletes joining us, all children will have brought home a sponsorship form. The children will take part in a range of different sponsored fitness circuits run by our athlete visitors in order to raise funds. It will be a fun-filled, action-packed day for all. This will be on the first day back after half term and will really kick start the week off in great fashion. ## Jumpers and Cardigans



Staff find that jumpers and cardigans are more prone to be lost in the Summer Term as pupils remove them during lessons or on the field at playtime or lunchtime. It is therefore vital that jumpers and cardigans (and all other items of uniform) **ARE CLEARLY NAMED** so that they can be returned to their owner.

## Summer Accessories

Children are encouraged to bring caps and sun hats to wear when they are outside. Sunglasses are also permitted outside. Please remember that anything brought in is your child's responsibility.

## Medication

Children who require medication for hay fever should be given this before they come to school.

Further, I would strongly recommend that parents of children who have an inhaler for asthma check that the medication they have in school is in date.

## Sun Cream

Please can parents ensure sun protection is applied to your child before arriving at school.

## Reminders

### Uniform Reminder

Please ensure your child comes to school in **full school uniform** each day. This

Includes:

- A white polo shirt
- Grey trousers, skirt, skort or gingham summer dress
- White, grey or black socks
- A royal blue cardigan or jumper
- School shoes only (no trainers, boots or open-toed shoes)
- Hair tied back (**Please remember that hair below shoulder length should be tied back. Hair bobbles are now available for children in school should they forget.**)

Please do not feel obliged to buy 'Ettington badged' jumpers, t-shirts etc. Similar items can also be purchased from your local supermarket.

**Reasonable Adjustments:** We understand that reasonable adjustments may need to be made for school uniform, especially if your child has sensory needs linked to SEND. If this is the case, please feel free to contact us to discuss requirements.

## Curriculum Information

The **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check** takes place during the week 9th - 13th June. The Phonics Screening Check contains 40 words, divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and pseudo-words (words that are phonically decodable but are not actual words with an associated meaning). The pass rate for all previous checks has been 32/40. Parents and carers can practise the Phonics Screening Check at home with practice papers on Google Classroom. Thank you to all the Year 1 Parents who joined us for an information session this week.

The **Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check** (starting in the week beginning 2nd June up to Friday 13th June) is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Children will have the opportunity to answer 3 practise questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. You can practise with your child at home using the Mathsframe website, which exactly mirrors the official check -

<https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/477/Multiplication-Tables-Check>.

There is no pass mark for the test and individual results will be shared with parents in our end of year reports. The national average score last year was 20.6 and 34% of children nationally achieved full marks.

Engaging in [Times Tables Rockstars](#) each week is an important part of helping our children to develop these key pieces of knowledge. The National Curriculum expectation is that all children know all times tables up to 12x12 by the end of Year 4.

Meals are booked through ParentPay, but if you require any assistance or would like to discuss your child's dietary needs further, please contact the school office.

### FREE SCHOOL MEALS

School meals are free for lots of families, check if you are eligible to apply!

### So much more than lunch...

A free school meal:

- creates healthy eating habits
- improves learning and behaviour
- saves money and time
- helps schools get extra funding

Did you know that claiming free school meals means that your child will get access to free school holiday activities and food?

### Can I apply?

Your child could be eligible for free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support or Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from National Asylum Support Service (NASS)
- Guarantee Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

You should still apply if your child is aged 4-7 and receives a universal free school meal

## What Parents & Carers Need to Know about WHATSAPP

WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service, with around two billion users exchanging texts, photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and video calls. Its end-to-end encryption means messages can only be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp can read them. Updates to its privacy policy in 2021 (involving sharing data with parent company Facebook) caused millions to leave the app, but the new policy was widely misinterpreted – it only related to WhatsApp's business features, not to personal messages.

### WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

**SCAMS**  
Fraudsters occasionally send WhatsApp messages pretending to offer prizes encouraging the user to click on a link to win. Other common scams involve warning someone that their WhatsApp subscription has run out (aiming to dupe them into disclosing payment details), or impersonating a friend or relative and asking for money to be transferred to help with an emergency.

**POTENTIAL CYBERBULLYING**  
Group chat and video calls are great for connecting with multiple people in WhatsApp, but there is always the potential for someone's feelings to be hurt by an unkind comment or joke. The 'only admin' feature gives the admin(s) of a group control over who can send messages; they can, for example, block people from posting in a chat, which could make a child feel excluded and upset.

**DISAPPEARING MESSAGES**  
Users can set WhatsApp messages to disappear in 24 hours, 7 days or 90 days by default. Photos and videos can also be instructed to disappear after the recipient has viewed them. These files can't be saved or forwarded – so if your child was sent an inappropriate message, it would be difficult to prove any wrongdoing. However, the receiver can take a screenshot and save that as evidence.

**CONTACT FROM STRANGERS**  
To start a WhatsApp chat, you only need the mobile number of the person you want to message (the other person also needs to have the app). WhatsApp can access the address book on someone's device and recognise which of their contacts also use the app. So if your child has ever given their phone number to someone they don't know, that person could use it to contact them via WhatsApp.

**ENABLING FAKE NEWS**  
WhatsApp has unfortunately been linked to accelerating the spread of dangerous rumours. In India in 2019, some outbreaks of mob violence appear to have been sparked by false allegations being shared on the app. WhatsApp itself took steps to prevent its users circulating hazardous theories and speculation in the early weeks of the Covid-19 pandemic.

**LOCATION SHARING**  
The 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, allowing friends to see their movements. WhatsApp describes it as 'simple and secure way to let people know where you are'. It is a useful method for a young person to let loved ones know they're safe – but if they used it in a chat with people they don't know, they would be exposing their location to them, too.

### Advice for Parents & Carers

**CREATE A SAFE PROFILE**  
Even though someone would need a child's phone number to add them as a contact, it's also worth altering a young person's profile settings to restrict who can see their photo and status. The options are 'everyone', 'my contacts' and 'nobody' – choosing one of the latter two ensures that your child's profile is better protected.

**EXPLAIN ABOUT BLOCKING**  
If your child receives spam or offensive messages, calls or files from a contact, they should block them using 'settings' in the chat. Communication from a blocked contact won't show up on their device and stays undelivered. Blocking someone does not remove them from your child's contact list – so they also need to be deleted from the address book.

**REPORT POTENTIAL SCAMS**  
Young people shouldn't engage with any message that looks suspicious or too good to be true. When your child receives a message from an unknown number for the first time, they'll be given the option to report it as spam. If the sender claims to be a friend or relative, call that person on their usual number to verify it really is them, or if it's someone trying to trick your child.

**LEAVE A GROUP**  
If your child is in a group chat that is making them feel uncomfortable, or has been added to a group that they don't want to be part of, they can use WhatsApp's group settings to leave. If someone exits a group, the admin can add them back in once; if they leave a second time, it is permanent.

**THINK ABOUT LOCATION**  
If your child needs to use the 'live location' function to show you or one of their friends where they are, advise them to share their location only for as long as they need to. WhatsApp gives a range of 'live location' options, and your child should manually stop sharing their position as soon as it is no longer needed.

**DELETE ACCIDENTAL MESSAGES**  
If your child posts a message they want to delete, WhatsApp allows the user seven minutes to erase a message. Tap and hold on the message, choose 'delete' and then 'delete for everyone'. However, it's important to remember that recipients may have seen (and taken a screenshot of) a message before it was deleted.

**CHECK THE FACTS**  
You can now fact-check WhatsApp messages that have been forwarded at least five times, by double-tapping the magnifying glass icon to the right of the message. From there, your child can launch a Google search and decide for themselves whether the message was true or not.

## Working Together to Improve School Attendance

### LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

### UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate.

It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'.

**All** matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

### **Leave of Absence taken in the academic year 2024-25**

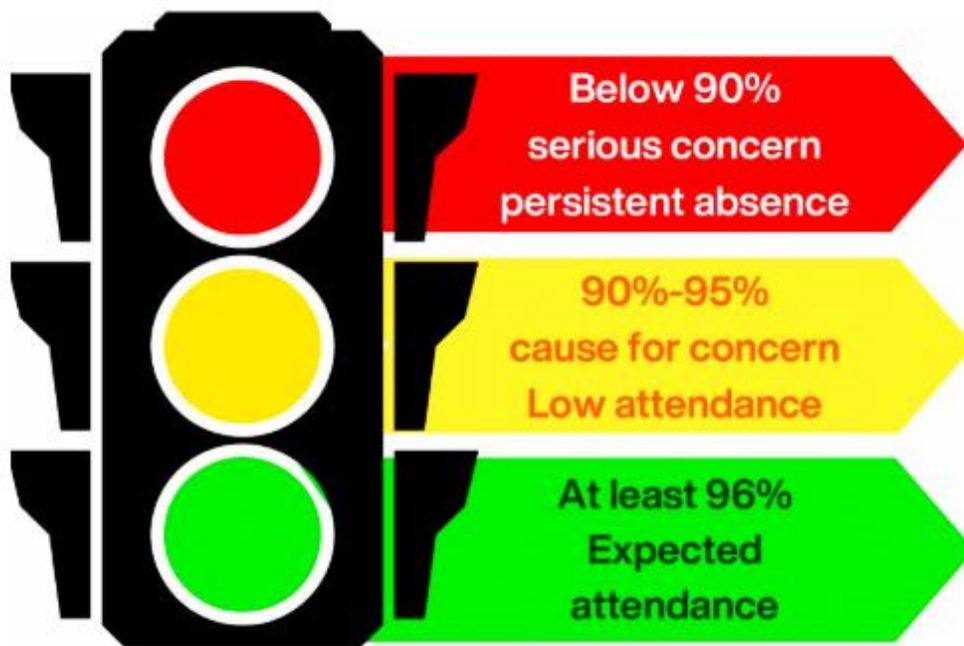
**The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.**

- Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices – 4 in total).
  - First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 for each child if paid within 21 days.
  - Second Leave of Absence offence within a 3-year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): The amount of £160 paid within 28 days. No reduced amount.
- Payment plans will not be offered and/or payments received outside of the 28-day period will not be accepted. Where a penalty notice expires unpaid the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider criminal prosecution.
- Third Leave of Absence offence within a 3-year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): A penalty notice will not be issued and the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under S444 of Education Act 1996.
