civilian	A person not in the armed services.
empire	A group of countries ruled by one leader.

Human geography	Man made features on the earth's surface.
military	The armed forces of a country.
Physical geography	Natural features on the earth's surface.
Peace treaty	An agreement to end a war.
territory	An area of land under the jurisdiction of a ruler or state.
