Glossary	
Vocabulary	Meaning
civilisation	The society, culture and way of life in a particular area.
pharaoh	A ruler of ancient Egypt.
society	A community.
pyramids	Burial tombs built for ancient Egyptian pharaohs
hieroglyphics	A system of writing that used pictures and symbols (hieroglyphs) instead of letters
canopic Jars	Used to store and preserve the main organs of their owner for the afterlife
mummification	The process of preserving the body after death by drying or embalming flesh.
archaeologist	The study of people and artefacts from ancient times.
continent	Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica.
physical feature	Natural features on the Earth's surface.
tributary	A river or stream flowing into a larger river or lake.
source	The place where a river begins.
mouth	Where a river flows into a larger body of water.
