

In addition, please note the following:



We require – white, grey or black socks or grey, navy or black tights

- No open-toed sandals or boots, black or navy enclosed shoes only
- Navy-blue scrunchies/bobbles to tie all shoulder-length hair back

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- Plain alice bands
- No jewellery except for a watch and plain stud earrings
- Make-up is not permitted at school
- Nail varnish is not permitted at school

Reasonable Adjustments:

We understand that reasonable adjustments may need to be made for school uniform, especially if your child has sensory needs linked to SEND. If this is the case, please feel free to contact either myself or Mrs Brown to discuss requirements.

As from January, we would like the children to have all year-round access to the field. Please ensure your child has labelled wellies that can stay in school.

Warwickshire County Council Admission Arrangements

Warwickshire County Council is consulting on its Admission Arrangements, Coordinated Scheme and In Year Admissions Process for 2025-2026.

In accordance with the School Admissions Code, the local authority must consult on their admission arrangements when changes are proposed, and at least once every seven years.

The proposed changes being consulted on for the 2025 year of entry are:

- the reduction of the published admission number at three local authority maintained primary schools;
- changes to deferred and delayed entry information following updated DfE guidance; and
- minor changes in the coordinated scheme regarding offering places from waiting lists after National Offer Day.

Warwickshire County Council is offering free Independent Travel Training for young people with SEND

Warwickshire County Council is proud to raise awareness of their initiative aimed at empowering young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) to lead happy and independent lives.

The County Council is providing free Independent Travel Training (ITT) to eligible young people with an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) who qualify for home to school transport assistance.

Traveling independently can be a significant milestone for young people with SEND, and the ITT program is designed to help them achieve just that. By mastering the skills necessary to navigate public transportation within Warwickshire, these young people can gain greater independence and broaden their horizons.

The ITT program is tailored to each individual, ensuring that it meets their specific needs and abilities. Typically, the program consists of one-to-one training sessions that occur once a week for a duration of 9 to 12 weeks, however this can be adapted to suit the needs of the young person. The duration may be extended to ensure the young person has the confidence and skills to travel

independently. Throughout the program, specialised Travel Trainers continually assess the progress and make necessary adjustments.

Attendance reminder

School starts promptly at 8.55am. School gates will be opened at 8.45am, the bell rings at 8.50am and the register is taken at 8.55am. If a child arrives at school after 8.55am without prior arrangements having been agreed, they will be deemed late. Registers close at 9.15am and arrival at school after this time, without prior approval or extenuating circumstances, will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Attendance below 96% requires improvement and below 90% is defined by the Department for Education as 'persistent absenteeism', which could lead to intervention from the Warwickshire Attendance Service. Good attendance is vital for the academic, social and emotional success of pupils.

Only 7 days off school from September until the Christmas holiday will make your child's attendance under 90%.


Our whole school attendance levels so far this year are 96%
