All home learning tasks are to be handed in and must be completed.

TALK HOMEWORK-This discussion-based task will be set occasionally in preparation for extended writing tasks.

HOME LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

- Read at home, little and often is the best motto between 20 and 30 minutes most nights.
- Homework should be handed in on time to avoid unnecessary upset.
- Please ensure that homework presentation is to a good standard.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME

- Praise your child and share an interest in what they are doing.
- Recognise their achievements and celebrate them.
- Ensure they undertake any home learning in a calm environment at a suitable time.
- Ask guestions to probe thought and recognise their own errors or misconceptions.
- Ensure they have the right tools to do the job.
- Take a break if required.
- If it is proving too difficult, acknowledge that and write a note on it for the teacher.
- The most effective home learning is based on conversation about the world around them.
