HOME LEARNING EXPECTATIONS	 Read at home, little and often is the best motto. The children need to read to an adult daily where ever possible. Please remember to write your comments in the Reading Record Book provided. Homework should be handed in on time to avoid unnecessary upset. Please ensure that homework presentation is to a good standard.
HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME	 Praise your child and share an interest in what they are doing. Read to your child to develop their vocabulary. Recognise their achievements and celebrate them. Ensure they undertake any home learning in a calm environment at a suitable time. Ask questions to probe thought and recognise their own errors or misconceptions. Ensure they have the right tools to do the job. Take a break if required – do not spend more than the recommended time. If it is proving too difficult, acknowledge that and write a note on it for the teacher. The most effective home learning is based on conversation about the world around them.
